Under the Shadow of His Wings

“Thy mercy, O Lord, is in the heavens; and thy faithfulness reacheth unto the clouds. There is no doubting that the Lord is merciful.

6 Thy righteousness is like the great mountains; thy judgments are a great deep: O Lord, thou preservest man and beast.

7 How excellent is thy lovingkindness, O God! therefore the children of men put their trust under the shadow of thy wings.

8 They shall be abundantly satisfied with the fatness of thy house; and thou shalt make them drink of the river of thy pleasures.

9 For with thee is the fountain of life: in thy light shall we see light” (Psalm 36:5-9).

One of the most difficult tasks that we’re called to perform is to give up control. The flesh continues to war with the spirit, and this battle lasts until we learn how to submit our will to his will. This is exactly what the Lord requires of us if we desire to be in obedience to his word. If we never learn how to trust him completely, we may never reach our place of full victory in him.

On the other hand, if I’m submissive to his direction, he’ll open the doors to greater blessings in my life. Instead of worrying about areas of life that I can’t control, I must learn to put it in the Lord’s hands (under his wings). It’s when we give the Lord full reign in our lives, that we have a peace that passes all understanding, and we can overcome because “Greater is he that is in me than he that is in the world.”

“He shall cover thee with his feathers, and under his wings shalt thou trust: his truth shall be thy shield and buckler” (Psalm 91:4).

Under His Wings

Being independent has its place in our lives, but sometimes the Lord invites us to come into his arms and under his wings for protection. Too often we put up a brave front and fight a spiritual battle alone. It seems, that when we are the most vulnerable in our spiritual walk, the devil taunts us when we cry late at night, and tells us that no one sees our anguish, or even cares about our sorrow.
