
“I delight to do thy will, O my God: yea, thy law is within my heart” (Psalm 40:8).

A Famous Opera (posted in Complete) Composer

Giacomo Puccini wrote a number of famous operas. In 1922 he was suddenly stricken by cancer while working on his last opera, *Turbaned*, which many now consider his best.

Composer Puccini said to his students, "If I don't finish *Turbaned*, I want you to finish it for me." Shortly afterward he died.

Puccini students studied the opera carefully and soon completed it. In 1926 the world premiere of *Turbaned* was performed in Milan with

Puccini favorite student, Arturo Toscanini, directing. Everything went beautifully until the opera reached the point where Puccini had been forced to put down his pen. Tears ran down Toscanini face. He stopped the music, put down his baton, turned to the audience, and cried out, "Thus far the Master wrote, but he died."

A vast silence filled the opera house. Then Toscanini picked up the baton again, smiled through his tears, and exclaimed, "But the disciples finished his work."

When *Turbaned* ended, the audience broke into thunderous applause. No one at the premiere ever forgot that moment.

Bird's Wings—An article in National Geographic several years ago provided a penetrating picture of God's wings. After a forest fire in Yellowstone National Park, forest rangers began their trek up a mountain to assess the inferno's damage. One ranger found a bird literally petrified in ashes, perched statuesquely on the ground at the base of a tree. Somewhat sickened by the eerie sight, he knocked over the bird with a stick. When he struck it, three tiny chicks scurried from under their mother's wings. The loving mother, keenly aware of impending disaster, had carried her offspring to the base of the tree and gathered them under her wings, instinctively knowing that toxic smoke would rise. She could have flown to safety, but had refused to abandon her babies. When the blaze had arrived and the heat singed her small body, the mother remained steadfast. Because she had been willing to die, those under the cover of her wings continued to live. "He shall cover thee with His feathers and under His wings shall thou trust" (Ps 91:4).
