Is There Ever Enough Time?

God’s Masterpiece

No matter how much I prepare to meet my responsibilities, I always feel that I could have done better, exerted a little more energy, wrote one more article, or prayed just one more time before calling it finished. Ministry involves moving forward. Never have I considered quitting or giving up. God forbid: Quit? How many people would be affected if I quit what I have been called to do? You think: what difference could just one tip of a rose petal make to a picture? Or, does it really matter if the corner of a baby’s laugh looks more like a Mona Lisa? We must be prepared, even when we are called to do a work that seems so insignificant compared to other ministries. We must keep moving in the direction that the Lord leads us. Maybe you are unsure of the steps you are ordered to take, just keep walking through your wilderness, and there awaits for you, a promised land. We are part of God’s masterpiece and he needs us all to complete his work.

Is there ever enough time?

Every day we rush around getting ready for work and our day. Why is it that:

- we shove the Bible aside to read the morning paper?
- when we’re held up in traffic, we complain instead of worship?
- when we’re tired, we prefer to eat or sleep, instead of refreshing ourselves by praying in the Holy Ghost?
- when we have a headache, we reach for Tylenol, instead of the anointing oil?
- we can spend hours shopping in the mall, and complain when we’re asked to go on outreach?

The Lord has a place for everybody to work in ministry. Not everybody will be able to do every ministry in the church, but we’re all called to do what we can, and to give our time to the Lord. In return, we’ll reap the blessings of an Almighty God who cares about us. Redeem the time, and you will be blessed. -gm
